Town of Holden Board of Health Meeting – Remote Meeting August 3, 2021

Michael Mazloff called the meeting to order at 5:39 PM

Gale Free Library COVID Guidelines

- Susan Scott, Director of Gale Free Library asked the Board about posting a sign to encourage patrons to wear masks. Susan had received a complaint 7/26/2021 from a parent, complainant was concerned about patrons not wearing masks in the Children's Room. The complaint was in writing so I need to respond.
- Michael Mazloff asked Susan how she would like to see the policy working
- Susan Scott responded it would not be a policy but a sign recommending the patrons wear masks when in the Children's Room due to the children under 12 not being able to receive the vaccination. She would like the Board of Health's support.
- Michael Mazloff stated when the children go back to school they will be required to wear masks. He agreed with Susan on encouraging all patrons, whether vaccinated or not wear a mask when in the Children's Room. He asked Michelle for her input
- Michelle O'Rourke agreed with Michael on all points
- Pam Harding stated she would be okay with encouraging but we cannot require masks.
- Michael Mazloff asked if it would be for the Children's Room only or the whole library
- Susan Scott stated when the complaint came in there was less of a crisis but with COVID numbers rising I'm thinking the whole library
- Michael Mazloff stated the intent is to protect children who cannot be vaccinated. He asked Francis about the library in Leicester, what are their protocols
- Francis stated children are required to wear masks in the Leicester Library
- Susan Scott stated she polled other directors from other libraries, some require masks in the Children's Room, others require masks throughout the whole library. The majority had some type of protocol for mask wearing
- Michael Mazloff and Michelle O'Rourke agreed that masks should be encouraged for all patrons
- Susan would like the sign to be worded as follows "The Board of Health strongly urges all patrons to wear a mask due to the inability of children under 12 being vaccinated"
- Michelle O'Rourke made a motion to approve the sign as worded. Michael Mazloff seconded -APPROVED
