

<u>Street Light Conversion Program – Update 2</u> May 2017

• The Light Department is the recipient of a grant from the State Department of Energy Resources (DOER) to facilitate the conversion of our street lights to LED.



- Several milestones have been met and we are looking to start installing the lights within the next 4-5 weeks.
- In March, we had an audit performed that identified every street light in town, as well as their location (GPS coordinates). There are 1,732 street lights owned by the Light Department, of which 1,274 are "cobra head" style, as shown in the picture.
- The cobra head lights are the ones being replaced under the DOER program. Replacement fixtures have been selected and ordered.
- We will be replacing the lights along the main roads and streets leading in and out of town first. Next will be the secondary "through" roads and streets. We will then do the remaining areas. (The lights along Main Street where the wires are buried underground will not be replaced.)
- It will take about a year to replace all the lights under the DOER program.
