This is a follow up from Jess P's inquiry to John Woodsmall about being able to use any remaining monies to remove the rocks and tree stumps in the spring.

Budget – FY 2017 – Our budget was submitted under the DPW's proposed budget and it will be reviewed by FinCom. We will not know if approved until all budgets have been submitted for Town Meeting.

Trails – Since the trails, etc, were not started this fall, and Liam Sullivan's family may have moved, Tanya will ask Jess P. for Liam Sullivan's contact information. He may be able to provide the name of another Boy Scout who would be interested in this project, or the name of a Scoutmaster who could assist.

Planning for 2017

Michael suggested that we all submit a plan for what we would like to see at Highland St., since we are not "locked in" to the huge butterfly garden that was proposed. We should be thinking long term as to sustainability, maintenance of the area, community appeal, etc. It was suggested that each of the members work on a plan – email it to all members - do not discuss via email – and just send your plan. All plans, ideas will be discussed at next meeting. Also discussed was planting of some apple trees in the front section of the lot.

Recruitment of new members

No new interested people have come forward. It was suggested that we contact the Senior Center to recruit as well as someone from the Agricultural Committee.
