

## Town of Holden Special Town Meeting Scheduled for Monday, October 17, 2022

The Town of Holden Special Town Meeting will be held on Monday, October 17, 2022, at 7:00 PM in the Auditorium at the Wachusett Regional High School.

**Holden, MA** – On September 30, 2022, the Board of Selectmen voted to approve the warrant for the Special Town Meeting to be held on October 17, 2022, at 7:00 PM in the Auditorium of the Wachusett Regional High School. Voters will decide on the following articles:


1. Easements for the Shrewsbury Street Improvement Project. If passed, the Shrewsbury Street Doyle Road Improvement Project will consist of improvements to approximately a 1.15-mile section of the Shrewsbury Street Corridor, including portions of Main Street, Holden Street, Chapel Street and Doyle Road. Proposed improvements include the reconstruction of the existing traffic signals at the intersections of Shrewsbury Street with Main Street, and Chapel and Holden Streets, as well as construction of a roundabout at the intersection of Shrewsbury Street with Mount View Drive and Doyle Road. The project is programmed in the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program for Federal Fiscal Year 2023.

The project includes roadway widening and geometric improvements at the various intersections, along with traffic signal upgrades, safety improvements, and pedestrian and bicycle accommodations. The project also includes an 8-foot separated shared-use path that runs the full length of the project that will be a dedicated walking and bicycling path. Other enhancements include new storm drain improvements, granite curb, concrete sidewalks, and landscaping features.

The Holden Finance Committee and Planning Board has voted to recommend approval for this article in the warrant.

2. Debt Exclusion for new synthetic playing fields at Industrial Drive along with playing field/playground renovations at the Dawson Recreation Area. If approved, the "Industrial Drive Athletic Complex and the Dawson Recreation Improvements" project will include a new soccer field complex, synthetic baseball field, playground, trail paths, and outdoor workout stations. The goal of the project will provide the Town with



expanded recreational capacity, promote outdoor activities, improve accessibility between adjacent recreational areas, and deliver flexible, multi-functional spaces for residents.

3. Funding for a design and engineering study for an All-Inclusive Playground to replace the current playground located next to Holden Municipal Light Department. If passed, the Inclusive Access Playground Committee will issue a request for proposals for the design and engineering study.

The Holden Finance Committee has voted to recommend approval for this article in the warrant.
