ATTENTION HOLDEN PROPERTY OWNERS 65 OR OLDER

Did you know that you may qualify for up to \$1000 off your real estate tax bill? A Real Estate Exemption may be available to elderly taxpayers who are record owner(s) of property and who meet certain Income and Whole Estate qualifications.

- CROPERY TAY 1
- Applicants must be 65 years old prior to **July 31, 2018**, have owned property in Massachusetts for 5 years, and have lived in Massachusetts for 10 years.
- Income from all sources in Calendar Year 2017 must be less than \$20,000 for a single person or \$30,000 for a married couple.
- "Whole Estate" which is balances of bank accounts, value of stocks, bonds and other securities as of **July 1, 2018** must be less than \$40,000 for a single person, or \$55,000 for a married couple. This does not include the value of your property.

If you think you may qualify, please call the **Assessors Office** at **508-210-5515** between the hours of 8:00 a.m.- 4:00 p.m. Monday, Wednesday, Thursday; 8:00 a.m.-7:00 p.m. Tuesday and 8:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. on Friday. We would be happy to set up an appointment to help you fill out the application.*

*Applications are applied annually to the **Actual** Fiscal Year Real Estate tax bill issues on or about December 31 each year, **not** the **Preliminary** Real Estate tax bill. The deadline for filing an application for Fiscal Year 2019 is April 1, 2019.

One of the boys hits a foul ball that kills the other boy's mother. The boy that hits the ball doesn't believe in accidents. Owen Meany believes he is God's instrument. What happens to Owen after that 1953 foul ball is extraordinary.
