



FROM OUR TOWN CLERK ~ JEANNE M. SURVELL

An expanded opportunity to vote by mail in the upcoming State Primary, September 1st and the Presidential Election on November 3rd exists for everyone.

<u>Vote by Mail Applications:</u> The Secretary of State Elections Division will send a "vote by mail" application to all registered voters who have not yet applied for either an absentee or early voting ballot for 2020. The



mailing is required to be sent by July 15th to all voters registered as of July 1st. The State applications will be pre-addressed back to the Holden Town Clerk and with pre-paid postage there will be no expense to you to return them for a ballot. For any persons registering or voters updating their voter registration address after July 1st, the Clerk's office will include an application with their acknowledgement notice.

You don't have to wait until the State sends you an absentee application, you can request one now from the Town Clerk's Office. Absentee applications are available at the

Senior Center, on the Town Clerk's website or the Secretary of State's website. You can send me a hand written letter or an email stating you'd like a ballot for some or all elections this year. In your request please indicate your choice of political party for the primary, state your residential address and mailing address if it's different from your residential address and a phone number to call in case we have a question.

Early Voting in Person: House Bill 4820, an Act relative to voting options in response to COVID-19, was passed by the House & Senate last week & was signed into law as Chapter 115 of the Acts of 2020. Thanks to the graciousness of Senior Center Director, Louise Charbonneau, the clerk's office will be able to offer in-person early voting for the September State Primary at the Senior Center dining room starting on Saturday, August 22nd from 8 AM to Noon and on Sunday, August 23rd from 8 AM to Noon. Early voting will be available at the Senior Center during normal business hours during the week until Friday, August 28th at Noon.

I hope that everyone will exercise their right to be heard at the polls while staying safe and taking advantage of expanded voting by mail. I look forward to hearing from you.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR TAX PREPARATION

Tax-Aide, a partnership between the IRS & the AARP Foundation, needs volunteer counselors to help low-and moderate-income persons in your community prepare their Federal & Massachusetts income taxes. Additional positions for site greeters are also available.

Last year over 4,700 returns were prepared at 41 sites around Worcester county. Nationally almost 3 million taxpayers availed themselves of Tax-Aide services.

Volunteers work 4-6 hours per week for the eleven weeks during tax preparation season - Feb.1st-Apr. 15th. Training for volunteer preparers will be on three Saturdays in December. Internet access and basic computer skills are necessary. For an application and/or further information go to: https://aarp.org/taxaide. Select "Volunteer." Then select Tax Aide from the drop down.
