Ryan Mouradian – Water & Sewer Superintendent – Board of Health Floor Drain Regulation

- Ryan presented the Board a slide show showing maps with the locations that could possibly be affected by the Floor Drain Regulation. He also stated that he researched other towns and found that Grafton and West Boylston both have the Floor Drain Regulation.
- Mike Mazloff asked why Holden didn't adopt this previously
- Ryan responded that this came up on a survey done by the state in December 2018.
- Michelle O'Rourke made a motion to adopt the Floor Drain Regulations, Michael Mazloff 2nd – APPROVED
